Working to bring services to women

The Newham Female Genital Mutilation Prevention Service

The Newham FGM Prevention Service is commissioned by the London Borough of Newham and delivered by the Manor Gardens Welfare Trust, as part of the Newham One Stop Shop. Our Services are free and confidential.

The Newham FGM Service has been helping and advocating for women living in Newham affected by FGM to improve their health and wellbeing. Many of the women have been referred to specialist services for further help and support with their physical and mental health.

The three key aims of our service are:

- To prevent the harmful practice of FGM within the borough through engagement with and support for individuals, professionals and the wider community.
- To provide high-quality support and empowerment to women affected by FGM to improve their health and wellbeing and to build their capacity to safeguard girls from FGM.
- To develop and support a borough-wide, effective and multi-agency response to FGM among statutory, non-statutory services and the wider community.

The services we can provide across the borough include:

- Information, guidance and resources.
- Confidential one-to-one support and advocacy for women affected by FGM.
- Community awareness sessions and volunteer community champions programme.
- Tailored training for professionals in Newham.
- A FGM Steering Group

The facts about FGM:

FGM is recognized internationally as a violation of the human rights of women and girls. Female genital mutilation (sometimes referred to as female circumcision, cutting or sunna) refers to all procedures that intentionally alter or cause injury to the female genital organs for non-medical reasons (2014 NHS).

There are 4 types of FGM, all of which are illegal in the UK and are considered a form of child abuse. FGM can have detrimental effects on the physical and emotional health and development of girls and women and in some instances can lead to death.

Some of these consequences are: infections, chronic pain, cysts, abscesses, fertility and child birth problems and even death in some cases. In addition FGM survivors can suffer severe psychological trauma and depression.

FGM is not a religious requirement or obligation. FGM has no link to Islam and is neither a requirement nor a Sunna in Islam. FGM is not condoned by Christian teachings in the Bible.

In the UK since 1985, counselling and abetting FGM or taking a child overseas to subject her to the practice, is a crime punishable with up to 14 years imprisonment.

Newham FGM Protocol


Newham Council has just released its FGM Protocol. The Protocol is a guide for practitioners and professionals to support their work on FGM cases. Cat Everett, Domestic and Sexual Violence Commissioning Officer for the London Borough of Newham and author of the protocol said:

"The Newham FGM Protocol highlights the partnership commitment to responding effectively to FGM. The development of the protocol brought together a multiagency group of professionals who share the same goal: preventing FGM from happening to Newham girls, providing compassionate support for women and girls who have undergone the practice and engaging with communities to build awareness and create capacity for change"

Cat also commented ***"The Protocol clearly sets out the response expected of professionals working in Newham and the role they can play in ending the practice. It also emphasises the importance of the Newham FGM Prevention Service. I would urge all professionals working in the borough to read the protocol and work with your colleagues to embed this into your practice"***

Community Champions

The FGM Service has recently recruited and trained 12 volunteer FGM Community Champions.

The Champions work to encourage and support communities affected by FGM to take positive action to tackle the practice, including raising awareness the risks and complications, the support services available and how to safeguard girls at risk.

Zinny Oriaku one of our recent Community Champion commented:

"I have thoroughly enjoyed the training provided so far. A lot of thought was put into creating a training package tailored to equip us to effectively perform our roles.

The volunteers received over 40 hours training which includes Safeguarding, FGM and the Law and how to support women and girls.

In the coming months our Champions are keen to work with women from the Somali, Senegalese, Gambian, Sierra Leonean, Guinea Bissau communities.
