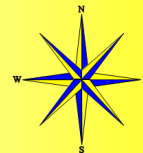

### Agents of Change

#### School Council Conference

On Monday 18th June 2018 Isa, Mariam (4AS), Tasnim (4TP) and Iasmina (4MM) met with eleven Newham schools for the first ever School Council Conference funded by Tate and Lyle at Park Primary school.

The day sought to inspire them to be Agents of Change in their local communities as well as their schools.

As well as playing team building games, thinking about what makes a good school council, and their own strengths and weaknesses as a representative, the children attended two workshops. One looked at promoting dialogue between pupils through understanding their emotions as well as those of others. The second workshop looked at how to plan a successful school council event

The children worked together with children from other schools, building their capacity to be confident speakers and good listeners.

The highlight of the day was a visit from Newham's Mayor Rokhsana Fiaz OBE, who inspired the children with a speech about how to be a successful Agent of Change. She said to the children, "Be inspired by people around you, look to them and learn from them about how to make the world a better place. The journey of a change maker may not be easy, but put your mind to it and you can be Agents of Change. Don't wait for someone to make you a leader, just be one. Raise your voice and don't let anyone deter you." The children were also lucky enough to also get the Mayor's autograph.
