
Dedicated staff

School day: settling in



School times

Our school day starts at 8.55am and finishes at 3.15pm. Nursery has morning sessions from 8.45am-11.45am and afternoon sessions from 12.30pm -3.30pm.

Breakfast Club

The school offers a breakfast club every morning from 7:30 – 8:30. Here, children can get a nutritious, healthy breakfast.

Uniform

We expect all children to wear school uniform which consists of a white shirt/blouse and grey/black trousers/skirt or dress along with a royal blue jumper, fleece or sweatshirt. Please ensure that all articles of clothing are

clearly labelled with the child's name especially school sweat shirts and coats as it does make returning lost property much easier.

School meals and snacks

School dinners

Our school is part of the Newham Free School Meals initiative, which means that every child is entitled to receive a free school lunch. Provision is made for vegetarians and for children who cannot eat certain types of meat. All meat served at school is certified Halal (HMC) and our


menu is also nut free. Alternatively, children may bring a packed lunch to school. Please ensure that it is packed in a suitable container and clearly marked with your child's name and class. Glass bottles should not be sent to school. Children may also go home for lunch. If they are being collected from school, then please be punctual and ensure they return to school on time for afternoon lessons at 12.50pm.

Break-time and drinks

All Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 classes have a morning break time snack of fresh fruit or vegetables.

Older children may bring fruit to eat at break time. Chewing gum, sweets and chocolate bars are not allowed in school. We encourage children to drink water regularly during the day. Children should bring a bottle of water each day. All of our under-fives are entitled to free milk which is organised by the school.

Curriculum: challenging and enjoyable



Confidence, communication and physical development

We believe that a happy child is a successful one, so we work together to present a curriculum that is exciting, challenging and enjoyable. We plan the curriculum based on our knowledge and the ongoing observations about how each child learns best. We look in depth into each leaner's needs, interests and developmental stages.

Aims

Through our curriculum we aim for all our children to develop as individuals and as independent learners. We strive for each child to reach their full potential and as a school we are totally committed to equality of opportunity for all our pupils. We have a consistent offer of support, care and guidance throughout our school and high standards of achievement.

The curriculum is divided into three stages:

- 1. Early Years Foundation Stage: from ages 0-5
- 2. Key Stage 1: from ages 5-7
- 3. Key Stage 2: from ages 7-11

Early Years Foundation Stage


The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum is based on seven areas of learning:

- 1. Personal, Social and Emotional Development.
- 2. Communication and Language.
- 3. Physical Development.
- 4. Literacy.
- 5. Mathematics.
- 6. Understanding the World.
- 7. Expressive Arts and Design

Key Stages 1-2

Areas of the curriculum are:

- Mathematics
- English
- Science
- Design Technology
- History
- Geography.Computing
- Art
- Music
- Physical Education
- Religious Education
- Spanish
- Personal, Social, Health Education (PSHE).



The whole school also undertakes termly projects with the Enabling Enterprise team which supports children in developing a range of skills such as teamwork, problem solving and planning.



Enriched curriculum: trips and visits

Trips

Throughout the year every year group is undertakes numerous educational visits to complement their learning in school. Recent school visits have included:

Residential trips

Year 6 children have the opportunity to attend an outdoor residential centre at Fairplay House. In the Summer Term the Year 5 children visit the Isle of Wight.

Local visits too!

Children often participate in local visits too. Recently these have included visits to local library, schools, churches, other places of worship and community events and celebrations.

Visitors

Visitors to school have included:

Life experience

Visitors provide our learners with real life experiences that can help them relate what they learn at school to the world around them and develop their confidence.





We recognise that managing behaviour is not just about responding to inappropriate behaviour but is about creating an environment that fosters positive behaviour. We believe that by fostering our children's sense of responsibility within school that this has a direct impact on behaviour. Classroom rules are negotiated with each class every September and displayed for everyone to see.

At Southern Road Primary School, we follow a 3-part Behaviour System: Rules, Rewards and Consequences. We also have a Chill & Chat Club and a Behaviour Club which provide additional support to those children who are regularly finding it difficult to manage their behaviour at school and need to reflect on that. Chill & Chat Club is for children who need some support or time out after an incident.

The Behaviour Club encourages children to:

- Reflect upon their behaviour choices
- Consider making better behaviour choices in the future
- Take responsibility for their own behaviour

We employ a whole range of strategies for celebrating pupil achievements and good behaviour; these include awarding significant achievement certificates which are given out at weekly celebration assemblies, targeted displays, and attendance certificates.

Inclusion: a curriculum for all

Inclusion: Special Educational Needs

We fully implement Newham's Inclusive Education policy, educating children with special educational needs alongside mainstream pupils. We ensure that all our pupils will access:

- High quality teaching and learning.
- A differentiated curriculum.
- Reasonable adjustments to the environment and equipment for pupils with disabilities.
- Assessment for learning with personalised target setting.

Additional support

It may be that your child needs additional support in school. This could be in the form of intervention groups or may require a more intensive level of 1:1 support. Some children with a high level of need may require an Education, Health and Care plan or top up funding to help them progress in their learning. Our SENCOs will fully support you through this process and explain each stage to you.

Working with agencies in partnership

We also work in partnership with a range of external agencies, such as the Educational Psychology Service and Speech and Language Therapy Service. A full list of support services can be accessed on Newham's website.

Interventions and resources in place at Southern Road to address SEND needs

Examples of the interventions and resources in place at Southern Road to address SEND needs include:

- Rainbow Class- to support pupils with social and communication difficulties.
- Speech & Language programmes (1:1 & groups).
- Lunchtime 'Chill and Chat' Club
- Sensory Room.
- Place2Be counselling support (Autumn 2018)

How accessible is the school environment?

Adaptations have been made to the school environment to ensure it is fully accessible for anyone with a disability.

Gifted and talented children

We recognise that all children are individuals with their own specific needs, gifts and talents. Children who are identified as being exceptionally able or talented, are monitored and provided with stimulating and enriching lessons appropriate to their needs.

Ongoing assessments

Teachers make ongoing assessments of all children in order to help them better plan the next unit of work. Children are also formally assessed for Reading, Writing, Grammar, Punctuation, Spelling and Maths each term to ensure they are making progress. Teachers have regular Pupil Progress Review meetings to identify children who may need additional support or interventions.

SATs

Children are assessed in the core subjects by their teachers, and at the end of Key Stage 1 and 2, by Standard Assessment tests (SATs). At the end of the academic year, parents of these children will receive these results as well as school teacher assessment results as we recognise that test scores don't always give the full picture of children's academic achievements.

School reports

All parents receive an annual written report from the class teacher at the end of the Summer Term which provides information about your child's academic attainment, progress and effort and summarises their personal, social development and other achievements.



Sport and P.E.

The school teaches P.E. including dance, and swimming in line with the National Curriculum. All children will participate in gymnastics, team games, field events and other related sporting events. We organise Sports days in the Summer term for the whole school. Parents are encouraged to join in with these events. We also engage in local sports events and competitions. We are proud to say that Southern Road always do well at these events (take a look at our trophy cabinet in the reception area!).

Exciting sporting experiences

The school has also introduced a variety of exciting sporting experiences such as visits to the O2 basketball finals, the annual Crystal Palace Fanfest with over 3000 children in attendance and to the Primary Panathlon Sports Event. Through events like these our children have the opportunity to see, meet and be inspired by Sports stars and Olympic athletes.

Music and Performing Arts

Music is an important part of school life. We often find it easier to learn through songs, sounds and rhythms and music forms an integral part of our Curriculum. We also teach music as a discrete subject which has lots of benefits for our pupils.

Singing

The children enjoy a regular singing session where traditional and new songs are learnt and enjoyed by all. Our pupils use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes.

Choir

Southern Road Primary School has a School Choir which supports school assemblies, concerts, special occasions and community events. The school choir has attended many events such as the Young Voices concert at the

O2 Arena in London. These provide a once in a lifetime experience with over 7,000 children participating from schools all over the UK.

Instruments

Children also have the opportunity to play a range of musical instruments and listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music. We are proud that music makes such a powerful contribution to the quality of life within the school community and beyond.

Drama

We are also proud of our wonderful dramatic performances that we showcase each year. We strongly believe these give a platform to children to build confidence, team work and show off the wonderful talents that they have.

Admissions arrangements

Nursery Admissions

Your child's name can be placed on our Nursery
Admissions waiting list at the age of 2. Parents/carers are
requested to complete a registration form, which can be
found under the 'Parents' section on our school website.
Parents/carers are contacted when a vacancy arises.
Please note that before deciding to apply to Southern
Road for a school or nursery place you are welcome to
make an appointment to visit the school.

Admission into Reception

The London Borough of Newham is the Admission Authority for this school and all admissions are organised centrally. Parents have a right to express a preference for the school of their choice and they should do so on the Newham application form. Expressing a preference does not, in itself, guarantee a place at this school. The LA recommends that you list at least three different

schools in case your first preference cannot be offered. You can apply online or contact the LA if you prefer to complete a paper application form. We hold regular open days for prospective parents to visit the school; these are advertised regularly on our school website and twitter account.

Transfer during the academic year

Some families move during the academic year and seek a new school. When this happens we welcome a visit before you make an application to Newham Borough Pupil Services. A transfer partway through an academic year this is known as an 'in year admission,' and more details can be found on this website: www.newham.gov.uk/inyear.

Voluntary helpers
