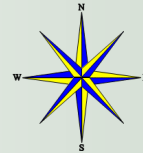

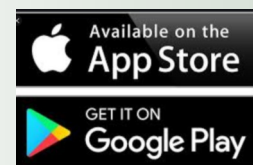
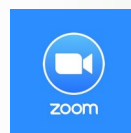
### Parent's Virtual Consultation Day
