Never put your head on top of a firework. Ask a neighbor before you set a firework off. Check if the fireworks are legal.

make sure you have a trusted parent with you or a responsible sbilling Never go close to lit fireworks! Always buy fireworks an authorised brand! Wear gloves when dealing with sparklers! Remember to keep your distance!

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
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
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Year group class work 'shout out of the week.'
