

### My Monster and Me

Everybody gets anxious sometimes – but if the anxiety grows so big that it impacts on a child's ability to play or go out with friends, it needs addressing. In this delightful picture book, a boy introduces both himself and his monster, who has been with him for as long as he can remember. It is big and bossy and has a tendency to get in the way and stop him doing what he wants to do. It also hides itself from his parents. And now it is enormous. This is such an effective book for reminding us all that though anxiety issues (or anger issues or indeed other mental health challenges) may be a part of life, they do not define us, and with the right strategies they can be managed.

# Training for Parents/Carers: Core Vocabulary Boards (CVB)

### About this Course:

You will learn what a Core Vocabulary Board is and why and how to use it at home with your child. There will be opportunities to ask questions about topics covered with the Speech and Language Therapists.

Core Vocabulary Board: CVB is a form of Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC). It is made up of colour-coded core words and aims to support the understanding and use of words to communicate.
