
Parent Survey March 2024

School Response

You said -

- Sessions for parents
- Healthy exercise or activities for parents

School Response -

Mr Permaul did organsie an after school club for parents to attend with their child. This is something we can look into and increase if there is a demand. Ms Henna in the past has organised a healthy cooking club (this was funded by an external provider) and we will look out for when this is available again so that we can offer it.

Ms Redman organised a read with your child after school session (during the week of world book day) and this was not as well attended as we hoped. There are however opportunities for parents to come into school for certain workshops and assemblies, relating to their child's learning. We are mindful not to overburden parents, as we recognise many have other commitments during the day. If any parent does have some spare time and wants to get more involved with events at Southern Road please consider joining the school's newly formed PTA.

You said -

- More variety of clubs that are interesting
- · Clearer transparency about clubs which are available

School Response -

Our clubs are run by staff in their own time (both during lunchtime and after school) and we are very grateful for the amount of activities we are able to offer. We do vary the clubs each term. Ms Burgess who leads on this is always open to suggestions for new activities that can be made available. We will aim to publish the clubs that are available in the newsletter and if your child has any suggestions as to what they would like more of please let Ms Burgess know. As you can understand for health and safety reasons the number of children attending each club does need to be limited and for that reason not all children will get into their club of choice.

- It would be useful to be introduced to the student teacher and to know how long they will be in class for.
- It would also be good if you informed us when our children are being taught by a trainee teacher.

School Response -

We are incredibly lucky to have a range of universities that we work in partnership with who are very keen to experience the outstanding practice at Southern Road. Moving forward we will certainly take this point on board and ensure trainee teachers are introduced via our weekly newsletter.

 To allow 25% childcare government support for payment of wrap around childcare.

School Response -

We are looking into this currently and hope it is something we can offer in the future.

You said -

- · More websites for learning at home
- More homework

School Response -

Our children have access to Oxford Owls which they can log into at home. There are also various website links posted on our school website which support with learning at home.

Your child should be reading daily and we ask parents to complete their reading diary. They also have access to Numbots in KS1 and Times Tables Rockstars. Weekly spellings are given to Years 1-6. In upper KS2, in preparation for secondary school, additional maths and English homework is given to consolidate the learning that has taken place that week.

You said -


 There needs to be an awareness of different holidays and traditions that affect our celebrations.

School Response -

We follow the term dates set by Newham, there is a set number of days school has to be open to pupils each year and this means we can't always cater to be closed for everyone's festivals and/or religious observances. Children who celebrate Eid for example (if this doesn't fall in holiday time/on a weekend) are allowed a single day of authorised absence which is recorded as a religious day.
